- + Dr. Brady
  - O Senior Prom will be on May 23 at Tendenza, 7:00 PM
  - Senior graduation will take place at the Curtis Center on June 10, 6 PM
  - CHAD Fashion Show: will take place at the School on May 29, 1 PM and 6PM)
    - Two shows: one during the day and one during the evening
    - Fully collaborative amongst the various groups in the school
  - O Discussed the recently completed cyclical monitoring unit facilitated by the State; Final report to be disseminated by PDE within 30-45 days
  - Staff updates: A new Special Education teacher has been hired; another school counselor has been hired, who will be starting May 1
  - Work in progress—Dr. Brady and the administration are reworking the function of staff in the building to improve effectiveness
  - Teaching and Learning:
    - Ensure that teachers aligned to provide quality education
    - Adding MTSS to the program (supportive services for students) for students to close their instructional gap
  - Keystone Exams
    - Ms. Fisher-Brown is still meeting with teachers and analyzing lesson plans
    - The staff is getting ready to implement Linkit
      - Using Linkit, CHAD will be able to upload SAT and PSAT scores as well to get a full picture of student progress for the entire school
    - Ms. Fisher-Brown is also working on teacher development with respect to the Keystone topics

- College Fair was held the week of April 15
  - Approximately 300 students attended
  - 19 colleges attended

## E. String Theory Schools

- + Jason Corosanite
  - STS team has conducted interviews with 39 faculty leaders
  - STS is conducting Weekly meetings with teachers
  - STS has performed a deep dive into SPED including technical support and compliance
  - o STS will be implementing school wide Professional Development for teachers
  - Compliance: Some STS staff have been working at CHAD including Thayne
    Dibble (STS Compliance Officer) who will be working with Andrew Phillips on
    compliance
  - SPED: Michelle Faulkner has been engaged with the SPED team on the cyclical monitoring; creating a plan for systems for IEPs; Data collection systems; created IEP tracker and spreadsheet
    - CHAD staff Toni Healy will be focusing on working directly in the classroom
  - o Trends that STS has found:
    - No day at CHAD is typical for the students
    - What should never change at CHAD?
      - Mission; majors; academic freedom; location; colleagues
    - What should change?
      - Support SPED; professional learning and development; increase communication
  - Security: STS director of security will work with Victor and do a security assessment
  - Infrastructure and Tech: STS technology director will be working with Jeff Speers
  - Classrooms: Smartboard systems are dated; STS will be looking at upgrading classroom technology for teachers and students
  - Culture and climate: Dani Shylit has been working with Jamal Elliot (a culture and climate contractor for STS) to provide coaching to CHAD teachers
  - O Data: Dina Angelina—updating all information and data; will work with SPED on Powerschool and compliance reporting
  - Testing Assessment: Rachel Ravior Stark 360 trial and Linkit
  - A full time School Designer will be onsite daily to further help CHAD
    - Emily Walkiewicz

# F. Business Controller

- + Michael McLeish
  - CHAD currently has 37 Days cash on hand, which is a drop from February, due to:
    - Three payrolls in March and the required PSERS payment made in March

- Subsidy: paid for 575 students (drop from February) and approximately ten students from outside of Philadelphia (Approximately 585 students enrolled)
- o Expenses:
  - As some positions hired late, those expenses are down, but contracted services are up in replacing salaried positions
  - CHAD is currently operating at an 80K surplus, but anticipate unfavorable variance due to low enrollment
- Cashflow statement—not much has changed since February
  - Projecting to end with 27 days cash on hand; Mr. McLeish walked the Board through the previously disseminated Cashflow statement
